ALFALFA HAY: Alfalfa hay prices remain firm and movement is moderate. Heavy snowfall, sleet, and ice cover most of the state this week. The extreme cold weather combined with strong winds has made it difficult for livestock and producers. Supplies continue tightening with the increased hay demand needed to sustain livestock in the frigid weather.

GRASS HAY: Grass hay prices are firm and movement remains moderate. Grass hay supplies have also tightened with the increased demand due to the extreme weather conditions.
