The drought continued to develop across the state under hot and dry conditions the past week. Over 61 percent of the state was in a moderate to extreme drought per the July 3rd Drought Monitor. Little to no rain fell in western and central Oklahoma, with a few isolated areas of heavier rainfall in eastern Oklahoma and the Panhandle: All crops suffered from the developing drought, though dryland crops fared worse with the lack of precipitation the past few weeks. Livestock conditions declined somewhat, as the heat took its toll on the animals, as well as the available pasture and stock ponds. Grasses were burning up and hay production was limited. Topsoil moisture conditions were rated mostly short to very short, with only six percent rated adequate. Subsoil moisture conditions were rated short to very short, with 14 percent rated adequate.--USDA.

Demand was especially light for unweaned, new crop calves. Deteriorating grazing conditions and high temperatures negatively affecting demand for this class of calves.

Alfalfa trade mostly slow but slightly more active than in recent weeks. Grass hay trade moderate to active. Dairy demand for alfalfa remains light but in spots improved over recent weeks. Demand from other sources mostly moderate. Grass hay demand moderate to good. Dairies bought on an as-needed basis over the past week and trades were on a load by load basis. Still some third cutting alfalfa being put up in spots. Grass hay baling continues active and both yields and quality have been good.

Grass Hay Central Oklahoma:

Prices steady, instances 5.00-10.00 higher. Fair to Good quality round bales mixed grass 4 X 5 and 4 X 6 40.00-60.00 per bale, mostly 45.00-50.00. Good quality 5 X 6 bales 60.00-65.00 per bale. Good quality Bermuda grass 4 X 5 bales 40.00-55.00 per bale, few 60.00. 5 X 6 bales horse quality 65.00-75.00. Small square bales of Bermuda 6.00-9.00 per bale, mostly 6.00-8.00 per bale. Compared to last week: Feeder steers and heifers not well tested but a sharply lower undertone noted. Hot, dry weather across much of the country has led to higher corn and lower feeder cattle. This has finally trickled down into the cash feeder market. Buyer and seller interest alike is light to moderate and taking the wait and see attitude with the markets this holiday shortened week.

Unless otherwise stated prices are FOB weigh point with a 2-3 percent shrink or equivalent and with a 5-10 cent slide on calves and 3-6 cent slide on yearlings from base weights. Current sales up to 14 days for delivery.
